

Admission/Enrollment

Enrollment Procedure

Home School Students

Students entering F.I.S.D. from Home School settings will be required to take a criterion referenced test, approved by the principal, before receiving credit for any courses they have completed. The transcript grade would be the grade they received on the test.

New Students to the District

The materials required for enrollments at F.I.S.D. are:

- Birth Certificate and Social Security Card
- Evidence of legal responsibility and residence
- Withdrawal form from last school attended
- Shot records [Current]

Registration

Before a student can be officially admitted to the Fayetteville Independent School District, appropriate registration forms must be completed and signed by the student's parent or legal guardian. A birth certificate, record of immunizations, and social security number must be presented at registration. It is the responsibility of the student or parent to notify the school office if there is a change of address and / or phone number.

Beginning enrollment

Students enrolling in the kindergarten program must be five years of age on or before September 1 of the current school year. In order to enroll in the first grade, a child must be at least six years of age at the beginning of the scholastic year, unless he has been enrolled in the first grade in the public school of another state prior to transferring to this school district. A birth certificate, record of immunizations, and social security number must be presented at registration.

New Students

New resident students who are entering the school shall provide evidence of attendance. They will be placed initially at the grade level reached elsewhere, pending observation by the classroom teachers and the principal. The principal shall determine final grade placement. All records from prior schools must be submitted to the office.

Transfer Students

Transfer students from other districts may be accepted on an individual basis, unless overcrowding results. Criteria for acceptance include student behavior, student achievement, prior attendance, student participation, parent cooperation and support, and teacher/pupil ratio in each grade level. Any student who is under suspension from another school district shall not be admitted until his/her suspension term has ended, or until released by the suspending district. Each transfer student will be re-evaluated each school year.

Withdrawal Procedures

If you will be attending classes on the day you withdraw, you must visit with the counselor and obtain a withdrawal form. The form is to be taken to each class for your teachers to initial as they check in your books. If you will be leaving without attending any more classes, your books will be left in the office for your teachers to pick up. All textbooks and class materials will be returned and all fines paid prior to our school releasing any records to your next school.
